Description

Talbert House provides multiple service sites throughout Greater Cincinnati with a broad range of services in four key areas: substance abuse, mental health, community corrections and welfare-to-work with a continuum of care that includes prevention, assessment, treatment and reintegration services. Services are provided with the agency's mission in mind: to improve social behavior and enhance personal recovery and growth. Talbert House served almost 25,000 registered children, adolescents and adults in FY 2008 in over 30 programs at 24 locations along with over 30,000 people through prevention and hotline services.

To address the realities of limited funding and the cost-containment demands of funders, Talbert House developed an affiliation a mental health agency, Centerpoint Health. Centerpoint Health maintains an independent 501(c)3 tax status as well as its own board; however, Talbert House is responsible for the financial, human resources and quality and clinical services.

PROGRAMS, PARTNERSHIPS, & AFFILIATE OVERVIEW

Talbert House is a community-wide nonprofit network of social services with over 30 proven programs focusing on Prevention, assessment, treatment and reintegration. Each year, Talbert House helps thousands of men, women and children across Greater Cincinnati and Northern Kentucky overcome adversity to become healthy and productive citizens through its programs in community corrections, mental health, substance abuse and welfare-to-work.

PROGRAMS & PARTNERSHIPS

1514 SECTION ROAD

This residential facility, formerly of McGregor Avenue, is for MR/DD males involved in the criminal justice system and/or in need of temporary housing. Outpatient alcohol and drug services are also available for men and women. The program also runs as a supported living facility for adults served by the Hamilton County Board of MR/DD who can live independently in the community.

ADOLESCENT SUBSTANCE ABUSE OUTPATIENT

This non-residential treatment program provides assessment and treatment for adolescents ages 12-17 whose primary diagnosis is a substance use disorder. Services include individual, family, and group counseling and case management.

ADULT SUBSTANCE ABUSE SERVICES

This program provides comprehensive chemical dependency assessment and treatment options to men and women in an outpatient setting. Services include individual and group counseling, intensive outpatient group services, continuing care, and random drug testing. Adult Services also provides outpatient services to clients dually diagnosed with mental illness and substance abuse issues and housing case management to clients in the Shelter Plus Care Program.

ALCOHOL & DRUG ADDICTION PARTNERSHIP TREATMENT (ADAPT)

ADAPT is a comprehensive residential and outpatient programs for men and women provide assessment, treatment, and reintegration services for drug and alcohol addicted adults charged with drug-related felony offenses through the Hamilton County Drug Court. Services include chemical dependency education and treatment, cognitive behavioral therapy, frequent and random drug testing, vocational/educational services, family counseling, and a variety of supportive services. This program is offered through a partnership between Talbert House and Central Community Health Board.

ALTERNATIVES

A residential treatment program for adolescent males ages 12-17 whose primary diagnosis is a substance use disorder. Alternatives uses cognitive behavioral therapy to provide gender-specific treatment for adolescent males to address issues of substance abuse, criminality, victimization, grief and anger and family dysfunction. It offers assessment, residential care, drug education groups, psychiatric services, intensive outpatient, educational services & continuing care.

THE BRIDGE

The Bridge is a residential treatment program for adolescent males ages 12-17 whose primary diagnosis involves mental health issues. The Bridge offers assessment, residential care, psychiatric services, educational services, individual and group therapy for both mental health and drug/alcohol issues, family therapy, case management, nursing services, and independent living skills training.

BROWN COUNTY RECOVERY SERVICES

Brown County Recovery Services offers a broad range of substance abuse and mental health programs including prevention, assessment and treatment services to the children, adolescents, adults, and families of Brown County and surrounding areas. The program works with the educational and criminal justice systems, the county Department of Job and Family Services, and the medical community to provide individualized services and promote healthy behaviors and improve life skills within families, schools and the community.

CHILDREN OF INCARCERATED PARENTS (CIP)

CIP assists incarcerated individuals through the transition from prison to the family and community. Programming includes case management, family counseling and linkage to employment, housing, legal education and community resources. CIP is a collaborative project of Talbert House, Ohio Department of Rehabilitation and Correction, Ohio Department of Job and Family Services, Urban League of Greater Cincinnati, Transformation Cincinnati/NKY, Council of Christian Communions and University of Cincinnati.

COMMUNITY CORRECTIONAL CENTER (CCC)

A Community Based Correctional Facility (CBCF) located in Warren County, CCC provides residential assessment and treatment in a locked facility. Serving adult male felony offenders from Butler, Clermont, and Warren counties, CCC is a diversion program intended to allow appropriate offenders to remain in their home community while receiving intensive programming in a secure setting for up to 6 months.

COMMUNITY LINK

Community Link is a welfare-to-work program that provides coordinated services to Ohio Works First (OWF) recipients to facilitate their transition to work placement and self-sufficiency. Community Link is a collaboration of the following agencies: Talbert House, Easter Seals Work Resource Center, Recovery Link and Alcoholism Council. Other agencies working with the collaboration are Jewish Vocational Services, Crossroads and Greater Cincinnati Behavioral Health.

CORNERSTONE

Cornerstone is a community corrections program for federal and state adult male offenders in a halfway house setting. Services include case management, chemical dependency treatment, criminality/behavior modification, restitution and child support, drug testing, education, employment readiness, and verified and monitored employment.

DRIVER INTERVENTION PROGRAM (DIP)

Designed to reduce the likelihood of repeated DUI behavior, DIP provides prevention and assessment services for first-time DUI offenders. Services include alcohol and drug education, traffic safety and referral. Specialized service are available for adolescent and Spanish-speakers.

EXTENDED TREATMENT

This jail-based, chemical dependency program provides substance abuse assessment, treatment, and reintegration for adult misdemeanor men sentenced by the Hamilton County Courts. Services include counseling, continuing care, criminality programming, employment readiness, and life skills development with specialty tracks for anger management, relapse prevention, assaultive behavior/domestic violence, criminality/behavior modification and family issues.

FATHERHOOD PROJECT

This program assists men to become the responsible, committed and nurturing fathers they want to be. Fatherhood Project helps dads strengthen their connection and involvement in their children's lives by providing classes, coaching and fellowship support meetings.

INTER-AGENCY SCHOOL CRISIS TEAM

The Inter-Agency School Crisis Team is trained to respond to crisis situations and have experience in dealing with children, adolescents and school staff. The team's mission is to help schools respond effectively during times of crises. This service is provided through a partnership between Talbert House, Centerpoint Health, Central Clinic, Red Cross, and Cincinnati Children's Hospital and Medical Center.

KENTON COUNTY JAIL-BASED SERVICES

This day treatment substance abuse program is for adult incarcerated offenders in Kenton County, Kentucky. Assessment, treatment, and reintegration programming includes group therapy, individual counseling, case management, and discharge planning.

MENTAL HEALTH COURT DAY REPORTING

This mental health and community corrections program provides treatment and reintegration as an alternative to incarceration for residents of Hamilton County. Using a cognitive-behavioral approach, the program serves up to 15 clients at a time to ensure a high level of accountability. In collaboration with the Mental Health Court Team, Crossroads Center, and Greater Cincinnati Behavioral Health, services include monitoring, daily reporting, drug testing, risk/needs assessment and life skills training. Job search assistance, educational services and financial management services are available.

PASSAGES

Passages is a residential treatment program for adolescent females ages 12–17 whose primary diagnosis is a substance use disorder. Passages uses cognitive behavioral therapy to provide gender-specific treatment for adolescent females to address issues of substance abuse, criminality, victimization, grief and anger and family dysfunction. Passages offers assessment, residential care, drug education groups, psychiatric services, intensive outpatient, educational services and continuing care.

PATHWAYS

Pathways provides transition for adult female felons and misdemeanants in a halfway house setting followed by aftercare services. Gender-responsive services include community monitoring, cognitive-behavioral therapy, chemical dependency and employment services. Pathways serves the federal, state and county systems.

PROJECT PASS (Partnerships for Academic Success in Schools)

Project PASS is a mental health and substance abuse program that provides assessment and prevention services for school-aged children and their parents through a partnership with schools. The program provides education services, case management and overall support for students and families. To address the social, emotional, and behavioral health needs of students and families, it provides flexible, unique and cost-effective services for promoting healthy functioning in schools, home and the community. Project PASS also is a partner with the Inter-Agency School Crisis Team and Family Peer Support Program.

RECOVERY HALFWAY HOUSE

This residential substance abuse program provides assessment, employment and chemical dependency services, and reintegration for drug-dependent and homeless men.

REWARDS JAIL INTERVENTION (RJI)

Rewards Jail Intervention (RJI) is a jail-based program for adult women referred by the Hamilton County Courts. RJI provides assessment, treatment and reintegration services and uses gender-responsive techniques in service delivery. Clients receive services based on their needs including education services, cognitive behavioral therapy, and treatment for prostitution, mental health and substance abuse issues.

SA/MI OUTPATIENT

This outpatient mental health and substance abuse program provides community case management and advocacy services for adults dually diagnosed with a major mental illness & substance abuse. A comprehensive continuum of services is available to provide clients the most appropriate care.

SPRING GROVE CENTER

Spring Grove Center is a community correctional program for adult males in a residential halfway house setting. Services include case management, chemical dependency treatment, criminality/behavior modification, restitution and child support, drug testing, education, and supportive activities.

SPARK (Strengthening Partnerships and Resources for Kids)

This program matches mentors to Greater Cincinnati children ages of 4-18 who have incarcerated parents. This partnership is between Talbert House and Cincinnati Youth Collaborative.

SUBSTANCE ABUSE PREVENTION

This program targets the prevention of substance use and abuse among youth. The goals are to increase effective coping skills and to identify at-risk youth and link them to the appropriate treatment resources.

TURNING POINT

This chemical dependency community corrections program's services include assessment, educational sessions, individual, group and family counseling, a six-month Continuing Care Program, and other supportive activities.

TURTLE CREEK CENTER (TCC)

Located in Warren County, TCC provides community monitoring, cognitive-behavioral groups, substance abuse treatment, employment services, as well as other specialized treatment services. TCC serves adult males in a residential halfway house setting serving 15 Southwestern OH counties.

UNION DAY SCHOOL

Union Day School is an alternative school program for students who are experiencing serious emotional and behavioral challenges impacting academic success. The program is a partnership between Butler County Educational Service Center and Talbert House.

WARREN OUTPATIENT

This program offers assessment, treatment, and reintegration services. The program offers reentry support and alcohol and drug treatment to residents of Warren County, Ohio, by providing behavioral health and case management services to help clients become self-sufficient.

WORKFORCE REENTRY

Workforce Reentry offers assessment and reintegration services to residents of Hamilton County who are returning home from prison. The program focuses on meeting the variety of needs associated with reentry through referral to mental health and substance abuse treatment, job placement, housing and other community resources. Case management staff works with male and female nonviolent offenders who have been released within the last 6 months. This partnership is between Talbert House and Urban League of Greater Cincinnati, Transformation Cincinnati/Northern Kentucky, Allen Temple, Dress for Success, and Ohio Justice and Policy Center.

CENTERPOINT HEALTH

Centerpoint Health is a comprehensive behavioral health care provider in Hamilton County, Ohio, that helps people realize their fullest potential in the community. In 2008, Centerpoint Health was formed from three local mental health agencies: Center for Children and Families, Core Behavioral Health Centers and NORCEN Behavioral Health Systems. OVERVIEW OF SERVICES

Centerpoint Health is a comprehensive behavioral health care provider in Hamilton County (Cincinnati), Ohio. Its mission is to improve the general mental health of individuals and groups in the community by providing a continuum of behavioral health care services to help them achieve their maximum potential.

With five neighborhood-based locations in College Hill, Oakley, Roselawn, Walnut Hills and Western Hills, Centerpoint serves children, adults and families. It holds accreditations and certifications from CARF (Commission on Accreditation for Rehabilitation Facilities) and Ohio Department of Mental Health. Most services are available at each of the five Centerpoint Health offices.

SERVICES

Outpatient Counseling

Outpatient Counseling is behavioral health treatment is available for children, families and adults. Includes specialized care for children such as sexual abuse services and the Juvenile Firesetters Prevention Program. Available at all locations, with the exception of the specialized programs.

Adult Case Management

Case Management services assist adults in accessing needed community-based services to improve their overall care. Case managers may work with clients on a variety of issues, including crisis management, budgeting, employment, housing, medication and primary care. Available at all locations.

Adult Support Services

Supportive services are available for adults who are severely mentally disabled. Services include respite care, day programs, and representative payee services.

Crisis and Prevention Services

Crisis and prevention services are available to children, families, adults and schools. Services include:

LEGACY

Centerpoint Health continues the legacy of its founding agencies: Center for Children and Families, Core Behavioral Health Centers, and NORCEN Behavioral Health Systems, Inc. These mental health agencies were formed in the early 1970s to provide mental health care in Hamilton County. In 2008, Centerpoint Health was formed through the consolidation of the three agencies to strengthen clinical care for clients, improve client access to care and reduce administrative costs.

To effectively and efficiently meet the needs of our clients, Centerpoint Health is affiliated with Talbert House, a social service agency that provides mental health, substance abuse, community corrections, and welfare-to-work services. Centerpoint maintains an independent 501(c)(3) tax status as well as its own board of trustees, and Talbert House is responsible for the financial, human resources and quality and clinical services for the agency.
